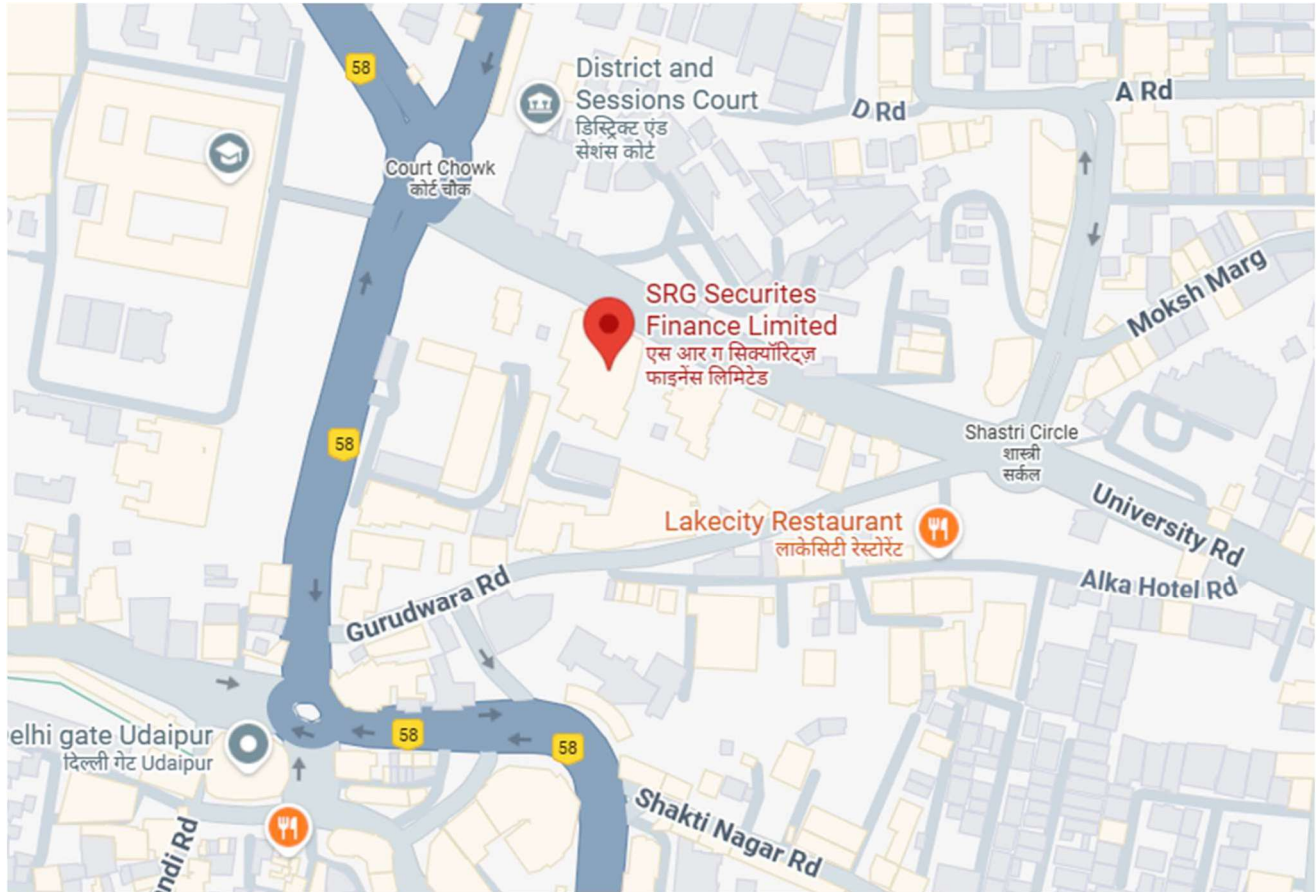

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION & ANALYSIS REPORT

GLOBAL ECONOMIC OVERVIEW

The global economy reflected resilience in 2025, navigating ongoing challenges such as increased tariffs, heightened trade policy issues, fiscal consolidation across major economies, and persistent geopolitical disparities. Ongoing geopolitical tensions, including conflicts in Eastern Europe and the Middle East and the Russia-Ukraine war, continued to disrupt global supply chains, energy markets, and investor sentiment, resulting in periodic volatility in commodity prices and financial conditions. However, economies gradually adapted through diversified trade routes, stronger energy security measures, and policy support, supporting a more stable and balanced recovery. According to the International Monetary Fund (IMF), global growth remained steady from 3.3% in 2024 to 3.4% in 2025. Headwinds from shifting trade policies are offset by surging technology-related investment, including artificial intelligence (AI), fiscal and monetary support, and broadly accommodative financial conditions. The economy in advanced countries expanded at a moderate pace, at 1.9% in 2025, reinforced by relatively stable labour markets, accommodative financial scenarios and recovering demand. Similarly, Emerging Markets and Developing Economies (EMDEs) witnessed steady growth, rising to 4.4% in 2025. This outlook is supported by improving manufacturing and services activity, continued infrastructure investment and resilient domestic consumption.

Global inflation is projected to decline, with headline inflation falling to an estimated 4.1% in 2025. Inflation remains above target in the United States, while it remains subdued across much of the rest of the world. Central banks must tailor monetary policy to uphold price stability amid ongoing shifts in the global economic landscape.

INDIAN ECONOMY

The Indian economy remained one of the fastest-growing major economies in FY 2025-26, supported by resilient domestic demand, infrastructure-led investment, and structural reforms. According to the Second Advance Estimates released by the National Statistical Office (NSO), real GDP is estimated to grow by 7.6% in FY 2025-26, with strong momentum driven primarily by private consumption and investment, with the services sector remaining the key driver. The manufacturing sector improved while agriculture provided stability despite structural challenges. Real GVA is estimated at ₹294.40 lakh crore, reflecting a growth of 7.7% against ₹273.36 lakh crore in FY 2024-25.

The Indian Non-Banking Financial Company ("NBFC") sector continues to play a significant role in the country's financial ecosystem by complementing the banking sector and improving access to formal credit across diverse customer segments and geographies. The regulatory environment continues to evolve with an increased focus on governance, capital adequacy, liquidity management, asset quality and risk management. Going forward, the long-term outlook for the NBFC sector remains positive, supported by India's economic growth prospects and increasing demand for credit, while sustainable growth will continue to depend on prudent underwriting, strong risk management, diversified funding sources and efficient use of technology.

OPPORTUNITIES & THREATS

SRGFFL witnessed significant opportunities driven by the continued growth of the Indian economy and the increasing demand for tailored financial solutions in underserved markets. The adoption of digital financial services and innovative fintech partnerships have enabled us to enhance customer experience and broaden our reach. However, the sector also faced notable challenges, including heightened regulatory scrutiny, evolving compliance requirements, and the rising threat of cyber risks.

According to a recent RBI report, the Department of Supervision will focus on examining licensing requirements for NBFCs and initiating supervisory actions against non-compliant NBFCs in the fiscal year 2024-25. The year 2024 saw many regulatory changes impacting the business model of NBFCs.

SEGMENT REPORTING

The Company is exclusively engaged in the Finance business and revenues are mainly derived from this activity. Accounting Standard 17 regarding Segment-wise Reporting issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 does not apply to your Company since revenues are derived from only one segment i.e. From finance activity.

SRGFFL's policies ensure timely identification, management and mitigation of relevant risks, such as credit Risk, liquidity risk, interest rate risk, operational risk, reputational and regulatory risks, which help the company move forward with vigour.

SRGFFL has an adequate system of internal control in place which has been designed to provide a reasonable assurance with regard to maintaining of proper accounting controls, monitoring of operations, protecting assets from unauthorized use or losses, compliance with regulations and for ensuring reliability of financial reporting. SRGFFL has documented procedures covering all financial and operating functions.

SRGFFL has robust internal audit programme, where the internal auditors, an independent firm of chartered

accountants, conduct a risk-based audit with a view to not only test adherence to laid down policies and procedures but also to suggest improvements in processes and systems. Internal audit observations and recommendations are reported to the Audit Committee, which monitors the implementation of such recommendations.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Pursuant to RBI Master Direction - Information Technology Framework for the NBFC Sector, the Company having asset size below 500 crores, adopted the measures as mentioned under Section-B of Master Direction - Information Technology Framework for the NBFC Sector. The board has approved the Information technology policy. The Company has adopted various measures for physical/ logical access controls, well-defined user role, a Maker-checker concept to reduce the risk of error and misuse and to ensure reliability of data/information, information security and cyber security, BCP Policy etc. Your Company is currently using in-house software for operations and accounting. Adequate arrangements have been made for backup of data.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

a) Basis of Preparation

The Financial Statements are prepared and presented under the historical cost convention in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), and provisions referred to in Section 133 of The Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 and other relevant provisions of The Companies Act, 2013 and accounting standards issued by The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) as applicable. The Company also follows the directions prescribed by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for Non-Banking Finance Companies to the extent applicable.

b) Income Recognition

Interest income on loans are accounted on accrual basis. Loans are classified into "Performing and Non- Performing Assets in terms of the directions issued by the RBI from time to time". Income recognition on non-performing advances are made in accordance with the RBI guidelines. Additional Finance Charges, Cheque bounce charges, Field visit charges and other penal / servicing charges are recognized as income on realization due to uncertainty in their collection.

c) Interest on Loans

Repayment of the Loans are by way of equated monthly installments (EMIs) comprising principal and interest. The interest is calculated on the outstanding balances at monthly rests. EMIs commence once the entire loan is disbursed. Pending commencement of EMI, pre-equated monthly installment interest (PEMI) is payable every month. Interest on loan assets classified as "Non-Performing" is recognized only on actual receipt.

d) Income from Investment

Interest income from investment is accounted on an accrual basis. Dividend Income on investments is recognized when the right to receive the same is established.

e) Segment Reporting

The Company is primarily engaged in the business of financing. All the activities of the Company revolve around the main business. Accordingly, there are no separate business and geographical reportable segment, as per the Accounting Standard on 'Segment Reporting' (AS 17) issued by The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India notified under The Companies (Accounting Standards) Amendment Rules, 2011.

f) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE) are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impaired losses, if any.

Depreciation on PPE is provided on pro-rata basis on "Written Down Value Method" from the date of installation based on life assigned to each asset in accordance with Schedule II of The Companies Act, 2013.

g) Intangible Assets & Amortization: -

The Company does not have any intangible Asset.

h) Impairment of Assets

Impairment losses (if any) on Assets are recognized in accordance with the Accounting Standard on 'Impairment of Assets' (AS 28). The Company assesses at each Balance sheet date whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If any such indication exists, the Company estimates the recoverable amount of the assets. An asset is treated as impaired when the carrying cost of assets exceeds its recoverable value.

i) Leases

In accordance with the Accounting Standard on Leases (AS 19), the following disclosures in respect of operating leases are made:

The Company has taken office premises under operating leases which are generally cancellable and have no specific obligation for renewal. The total lease payments are recognized as per lease terms in the Statement of Profit and Loss under 'Rent Expenses' under note 20.

j) Provision on Non-Performing Assets & for diminution in Investment value

Non-performing assets are identified and categorized into Sub-standard, Doubtful and Loss Category based on the guidelines and direction issued by RBI. Provisions for non-performing assets and for diminution in investment value are made in the accordance with the RBI guidelines.

k) Contingent Liabilities

No Contingent Liabilities were recognized by the management during the year.

l) Investments

In accordance with Accounting Standard (AS 13) on "Accounting for Investments" and the guidelines issued by the Reserve Bank of India, Current Investments are stated at lower of cost and fair value. However, Provision for diminution in value of investment is made to recognize a decline in value other than temporary in nature. On sale of an investment, the difference between it carrying value and net sale proceeds is charged or credited in the statement of profit and loss. Unquoted investments in the units of mutual funds in the nature of current investments are valued at the net asset value declared by mutual funds in respect of each particular scheme.

m) Employment benefit: -

i. Gratuity:-

Gratuity is a post-employment benefit. During the year 2025-26, the Company has made provision for gratuity and the detail of the same in under note no. 8 of the notes on Financial Statements for the year ended 31st March 2026.

ii. Provident Fund :-

Pursuant to Employees' Provident Fund Act, the payment under Employees Provident Fund Act is not applicable to the Company.

iii. Employee state Insurance:-

The Company contributes amount to Employee state Insurance as per the provisions of the Employee State Insurance Act and is recognized as an expense in the period in which the services are rendered.

iv. Short Term Employee Benefits: -

Short Term Employee Benefits are recognized during the period when the services are rendered. These Short-term benefits include Bonus, Incentive and other benefits which fall due within twelve months after the end of the period in which services are rendered.

n) Accounting For Taxes on Income

The accounting treatment for the Income Tax in respect of Company's Income is based on the Accounting Standard on "Accounting for taxes on Income" (AS 22). Income tax expenses is the aggregate amount of current tax and deferred tax charge, Taxes on income are accrued in the same period as the revenue and expenses to which they relate. Current Tax is determined in accordance with the Income Tax Act 1961, on the amount of tax payable in respect of income for the year.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are recognized for the future tax consequences of temporary differences arising between the carrying value of assets and liabilities. Deferred tax assets are recognized only after giving due consideration to prudence. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using tax retards and tax laws that have been enacted (or) substantially enacted by the balance sheet date.

o) Earnings Per Share

The Company reports basic and diluted earnings per equity share in accordance with (AS) 20, Earnings per share issued by the Institute of Chartered accountants of India. Basic earnings share has been computed by dividing net income by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding for the period. Diluted earnings per equity shares have been computed using the weighted average number of equity shares and dilutive potential equity shares outstanding during the period.
